

# Little Somethin' Jacket



## Class Supplies

All class supplies except fabric are available at Denton Sewing Center. Students will receive a 15% discount of class supplies.

## Little Somethin Jacket Pattern

This casual jacket can be made with long sleeves or  $\frac{3}{4}$  length sleeves. You also have the choice of jacket length. Sews up well in cotton or rayon batik fabric. Pattern uses an interesting shoulder and neckline treatment.

## Sewing Machine

- Foot Control & Power Cord
- Standard Foot

## Serger - optional, but helpful.

- Set up for 3-thread wide overlock.
- Serger thread should blend with fabric.

## Needles & Thread

- Sewing thread in color to blend with fabric
- Bobbin wound with the sewing thread
- 80/12 universal needle

## Tools & Notions

- Glass head straight pins
- Fabric marker that is visible on fabric and is easily removed
- Sewing awl
- Seam gauge
- 8" bent handle shears
- Small scissors for trimming fabric and clipping threads.
- 24" rotary ruler.
- Pressing ham & sleeve roll - optional, but helpful.

## Do Before Class

- Decide which view and size you want to sew. I suggest going up one size. I usually wear a size 12 jacket. I cut a size 14 and I'm glad I did.
- Purchase the correct amount of fabric. (Fabric suggestions and lengths are provided on the pattern instructions. )
- Wash, dry and press the fabric.
- Layout and pin the pattern to the fabric. (Layouts are available for various sizes.)
- Cut out all pieces *except Front A*.
- Leave pattern pinned to fabric.
- To avoid folding the pattern pieces/fabric, clip them to a hanger.
